Thought of the Week The crowds at a football match sit in the stands or stand on the terraces, when they are allowed to turn up in person. They may wear the strip of their team, but they don't wear colours for both teams and they certainly do not actually play the game on the pitch. However, they do engage in the game from where they are. You can hear the reactions to the game. A priest friend

of mine used to be at St Alphonus, Old Trafford [now closed], and, when Man Utd played at home, you could stand on his doorstep and know exactly what was happening in the ground, by the way the crowds participated. Deep down, we all know that "joining in" is something more than just standing and sitting with everyone else. It is possible, though a bit unusual to go to Old Trafford Soccer Stadium and engage not one little bit with the team or the game or even with the crowd. When we come to mass or watch it online, we are seeking to engage prayerfully as much as we can. We do not mean to just watch. We can stand and sit (and sing at home!) but without actually engaging in the action of the Mass, we do not really participate. We don't expect to say the readings with the Lector or the Intercession with the Reader. We don't expect to recite the Gospel with the Deacon or the Consecration with the Priest and yet we join in as fully as we are able. If I don't lift up my heart and mind to God, I don't achieve "Lift Off" and that is what we mean by participation. If a choir sings or a cantor chants the psalms, I am not excluded, unless I excluded myself!! Worship at Mass is a very great deal more than simply receiving Holy Communion; children, visitors, non-Catholics are all included and can receive God's many graces if they lift up their hearts and minds to God in prayer.

Matthew 21:33-43

Gospel Reflection *When the Lord first told this Sunday's parable, He wanted the Sons and Daughters of Israel to understand properly how their non-acceptance of the Prophets and of Him was a rejection of God the Father Himself. We continue to reread this parable because the same point still needs making. We still want to make things ours, when in fact they are God's! "I want" not Thy Will be Done is a perpetual problem. The Vineyard and its fruit belong to Christ the Divine Son, Word Incarnate. Thinking there are no consequences to seizing His property is a massive self-deception. Killing the Son today by ignoring Him, rejecting and ridiculing Him hurts us now and in the world to come, if we do not repent and give Him His fruit.*

Apostles Creed I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.
