
CONFESSIONS BY APPOINTMENT ONLY AT PRESENT

Thought of the Week In normal circumstances, we would normally be singing a hymn whilst the collection is taken and Father performs the Offertory of the Gifts. Not surprisingly, we therefore focus on the words in front of us and the tune we need to remember. However important this is, we still need to pray the Offertory. This is something that the Corona Crisis forces us to do. It is not merely a functional action of the priest with no significance. It relates to many things. We mentioned it last week in connection with Harvest Thanksgiving and it is mentioned across the page in the Gospel Reflection. Watching what is going on is at least participation with the eyes. More, I need to pray, that is lift up my heart and mind towards the

Lord. In particular, we need to offer ourselves with the bread and wine for consecration. We need to give ourselves consciously to God, to co-operate with His plan for us, for our world and for the extension of His Kingdom on earth [Mission]. The Offertory also represents the First of the Four Great Eucharistic Actions of Jesus, 1) He Took 2) He blessed 3) He broke 4) He gave. As such, it is not insignificant.

Gospel Reflection The point about the coin used to pay the Roman taxation was that it was marked clearly as belonging to Caesar, through the imprint of the emperor's head on it. Christ's subtle point is that the whole of creation, including us, bear the imprint and handiwork of God. Whilst Christ does say it is licit for Christians to pay taxes to the civil power, His main thrust is that we need to give back to God what is His, ourselves, our souls and bodies and the whole of creation. This relates directly to the Offertory at Mass, where the fruits of the earth and the work of human hands are presented for God to use for His Kingdom. They belong to Him and we give Him of His own. Graciously, He allows the stewards of creation [US] the use of His good things to sustain and enrich our lives, but they remain His!

Apostles Creed: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.
