Remembrance Weekend 7th/8th November The annual weekend of prayer for all who died in war falls on the Sunday closest to the Armistice of the First World War. Please see local press in Tetbury for the special arrangements this year at St Saviour's because of the Pandemic. Both our Sunday morning Masses will be Requiems for the war dead, using the Sunday Mass readings. The Saturday Evening Vigil Mass will be the Green Sunday Mass. The Act of Remembrance and The Silence will be included in all Masses.

The November Remembrance List the month of November has been given over to the prayer for the Holy Souls long before the devastation of two world wars in a single

century made others come to this observance. Visits to graves and cemeteries are a traditional part of this, as well as cenotaphs and war memorials. The chief form of prayer for the dead is the Mass. Purple pages will be available from next Sunday on which to write the names of loved ones. There will also be special envelopes (when they arrive!!) into which you can put the purple page and a mass offering. These envelopes for the Altar List of the Dead can be handed into the sacristy or given to Father at the door. This November Dead List will be on the altar for all masses throughout the month. We aim to offer a Mass for the dead every other day to allow for other intentions and if we have sufficient requests, there will also be one mass a month for the rest of the year.

MASS TEXTS

Entrance Antiphon: Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and His strength; constantly seek His face.

Gospel

Matthew 22: 34-40

Gospel Reflection *The Pharisees thought they could confound the Incarnate Son of God. They could not!! This is a religious dispute as yet, not involving the Roman Occupiers. The Scribes and Temple clergy had quarrelled for centuries about which was the most important statute of the Mosaic Law. Christ authoritatively settles this question. When the Word Made Flesh speaks the Commandments of Love they gain new weight and importance. The theme of love runs through the Saviour's teachings in all four gospels. He orders us to do what He enables us to do. On the cross, He demonstrates love for God and neighbour perfectly and from His wounded side the Sacred Heart pours out His graces to make us able to do the same.*

Apostles Creed: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

Communion Antiphon: We will ring out our joy at your saving help and exult in the name of our God.

Act of Spiritual Communion Lord Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love You above all things, and I passionately desire to receive You into my soul. Since I do not now receive You sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul, so that I may unite myself wholly to You, now and forever. Amen.
