VENERATION OF THE MARTYRS IN LENT The Church of Rome, has always visited the tombs of the saints in Lent and sung the Litany of the Saints each day.

1. Firstly, the walk to the shrine is a reminder of the Lenten journey to Easter.
2. Secondly, it is a request for the prayers of the saint or saints, for our daily discipleship as Christians.
3. Thirdly, we are to be encouraged by their victory over suffering, as we face our own temptations and difficulties. They are the victors and we still have to engage in spiritual warfare.
4. Fourthly, the ancient belief that at the point of death, the martyr was granted a vision of the Risen Lord, means that a visit to their relics brings us closer to Easter too.

Second Reading Romans 8:31-34 *God did not spare His own Son*

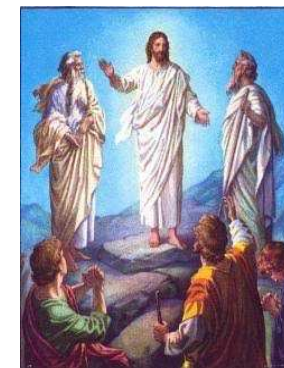
Gospel Acclamation Glory and praise to you, O Christ! From the bright cloud the Father's voice was heard: 'This is my Son, the Beloved. Listen to him.' Glory and praise to you, O Christ!

Gospel Mark 9:2-10 *This is my Son, the Beloved*

Apostles Creed: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Just as last Sunday showed us Jesus' understanding for our weakness and susceptibility to temptation, this Sunday shows us the Saviour's understanding of just how difficult it is to keep going in the face of adversity. He knows about His coming Passion, Cross and Resurrection, with the opposition of both Roman and Temple authorities. His plan for His

Universal Church cannot fail because the Apostles cannot cope or understand the deeper meaning. Thus, He toils up Mount Thabor with Peter and his companions, so that He can reveal to them the uncreated and glorious light of His Transfiguration. Before the inhuman cruelty, suffering and apparent failure, Christ uncovers His Divinity to them, to keep them going. As we continue through Lockdown and its challenges, the Divine and Human Natures of the One Saviour show us that He is with us and encourage us to keep going.
