4. Drawing closer to the Risen Lord, for our ancient belief is that at the point of death, the martyr was granted a vision of the Risen Lord.

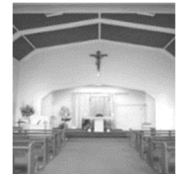

Gospel John 3:14-21 *God sent His Son so that through Him the world might be saved*

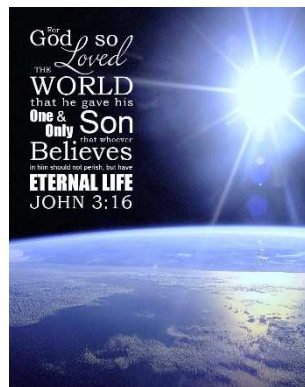


Apostles Creed: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from there He will come and judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK Jesus refers to the ancient account of the Exodus and the people being spared from fatal serpent bites. The serpents came as a result of their sins, but God ordered Moses to raise a Bronze Serpent on a pole and asked the people to look up to it. This becomes a foreshadowing of Christ Himself lifted up on the Cross for the deliverance of the world. To look to Christ Crucified is to trust in His Divine Mercy and the loving compassion of the Father, Who wants to see us flourish. Our actions always have consequences, that must be faced up to, but God has more to say that just punishment and sorrow: He loves and saves.
