- For all who have died; that the Angels may welcome them to the Heavenly Banquet




'REGINA COEL' - THE EASTER GREETING TO OUR LADY

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK I, the branch, am alive in the Vine, because its life-giving sap flows to me and through me. The Lord speaks this image of the True Vine at the Last Supper as something for the Post Easter Church to think about. The Vine is alive because of the Resurrection. How, then, does the life of the Risen Lord flow to me and through me? Part of the answer is the gift of the Holy Spirit, Whom we celebrate as Eastertide closes. The

Spirit brings me the presence of the Risen Lord. Another part of the answer is the Sap of the Vine. This Sap is Grace, the free gift of the love, life and power of the Lord. This Graceful Sap flows in the Sacraments, in the assembly of the Faithful and in prayer. Christ also bestows His graces in unexpected ways and situations. I need the Spirit and the Gracious Sap to be alive in the Risen Lord. I also need the Church, the Assembly of the Faithful with their legitimate pastors. Christ is in our midst, when we meet in His Name. The Spirit calls together the Church and it is in that Assembly that we celebrate the Sacraments, read the Scriptures and grow in prayer - Vine and Branches forever united.
