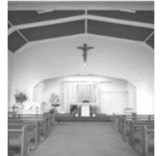

**THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK** The Book of Acts describes the Descent of the Holy Spirit as being like tongues of flame and the rushing of wind. It does not say the Holy Spirit IS fire or wind. This picture language enables us to understand a little of what God the Paraclete does. Flames give light and God enlightens. Fire cooks our food and God transforms us into His likeness. Fire hardens pottery and God gives us strength and courage. Fire consumes our rubbish and, unlike our rubbish incineration, God burns away our faults and does no harm in the process.



Wind drives our sails and our mills, just as God the Holy Spirit is dynamic and active. God moves us and stirs us. As in the process of winnowing grain, the Spirit blows away the dross and leaves only good behind.

Despite these Biblical images, we do not use fire and wind in our public worship on a regular basis. Instead, for many centuries the touch of God's Spirit has been conveyed with Holy Oil. Three oils in particular are employed in the Sacraments and other special ceremonies, Oil of Catechumens Oil of the Sick, and the perfumed Oil of Sacred Chrism.

Catechumens are men, women and teenagers, preparing for Holy Baptism. The word means Inquirer. During the run up to the waters of the Font, they are anointed for strengthening and preparation. Sometimes, Oil of Catechumens is called Oil of Baptism, because of its use in the run up to this Sacrament.

Sacred Chrism is oil mixed with natural perfume and aromatic substances, like resins and spices. It is a rich oil, used after the flow of the waters of Baptism. In the Sacraments of Confirmation and Ordination, it is used to show that God is working powerfully in and on the Candidate.

For those who are seriously ill or who have grown weak through old age, the Oil of the Sick conveys the healing touch of the Saviour and the strength of the Spirit. For some this will bring about spiritual and physical healing in this world. For others, it will aid them in the journey to spiritual healing in the next life.

Besides the Sacraments, these oils are used to bless bells, altars, church buildings, chalices and patens for Mass.

**Introduction to our Renewal of Confirmation**

On the day of Pentecost, today, the apostles received the Holy Spirit as the Lord had promised. Having the fullness of Holy Orders, they also received the power of giving the Holy Spirit to others and so completing the work of baptism. This we read in our Acts lesson this Sunday. When Saint Paul placed his hands on those, who had been baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they began to speak in other languages and in prophetic words.



In our day the coming of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation is rarely marked by the gift of tongues, but, by faith, we continue to recognize His work in us. He fills our hearts with the love of God, brings us together in one faith but in different vocations, and works within us to make the Church one and holy.

The gift of the Holy Spirit that the Confirmed receive was a spiritual sign and seal to make us more like Christ and more perfect members of His Church. At His baptism, by John, Christ Himself was anointed by the Spirit and sent out on His public ministry to set the world on fire.

All of us already been baptized into Christ have received the power of His Spirit by the sign of the cross on our forehead, traced with Holy Chrism. We must be witnesses before all the world to His suffering, death, and resurrection, with a way of life that should at all times reflect the goodness of Christ.

Christ gives many varied and different gifts to His Church, and the Spirit distributes them among the individual members of Christ's Mystical Body, to build up the holy people of God in unity and love. In our Renewal of Confirmation this Sunday, we seek to be active members of the Church, alive in Jesus Christ. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, may we give our lives completely in the service of all, as did Christ, who came not to be served but to serve.



**PRAYER TO ST MICHAEL** Holy Michael Archangel, defend us in the day of battle. Be our safeguard against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God thrust down to hell Satan and all wicked spirits, who wander through the world for the ruin of souls.
