

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK The "Rosary Technique of Meditation" (using familiar, vocal prayers and counting beads to free the mind to ponder on the scene) is used in the

Dominican Rosary to ponder on 4 sets of 5 mysteries. St Dominic gave this from to the tradition to help convert the Albigensian Heretics to the Faith. The same Technique of Medittation is used in other forms of the Rosary. The Franciscan Friars use a rosary of 7 decades to ponder the 7Joys of Our Lady, whilst the Servite Friars use the Dolour Rosary and meditate of the 7 sorrows of the Virgin. There is a Chaplet of the Holy Name, using only Our Fathers and other ways. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy uses the same counting



beads as a standard Rosary. Other variations exist. We ourselves can us this technique on many of the Gospel stories and the parables of the Saviour.

RENEWING OUR LITURGICAL MINISTRIES The Diocesan Liturgy Office has arranged for Fr Paul Turner of the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Kansas City, Missouri and Director of the Office of Divine Worship for the Catholic Diocese of Kansas City-St Joseph, to give some input to our Liturgical Ministers on 'renewing our liturgical ministries'. Fr Paul is an internationally renowned liturgist who was recently appointed by Pope Francis as a Consultor to the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments. Fr Paul will be talking to our liturgical ministers, particularly ministers of hospitality, reading and Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, in the Apostle Room of our cathedral on Saturday 12 November beginning at 10.30am and ending at 3.30pm.
