OCTOBER - MONTH OF THE ROSARY The Rosary is often said to be a Marian devotion. Undoubtedly, this is most obviously true in the repeated Hail Marys. We are invited to look with Mary at the various scenes for meditation. That said, at a deeper level, the Rosary is focussed mostly on Christ, His life, death and resurrection, as the Rosary Collect says. At the heart of every Hail Mary, is Christ's own Holy Name, at which we bow our heads. With Our Lady, we look at the 4 sets of mysteries. The 4th and 5th Glorious Mysteries obviously relate to His Holy Mother, but she was taken up to heaven by Him and crowned by Him. The glory of all the saints is His glory shared with them. There is no Gospel without the Mother of God, but they is no Good News at all without the Saviour. Per Mariam, Ad Jesum!
