As part of the Parishes in Communion for Mission Father Michael Davies, Parish Priest of St Peter's Church, Cirencester has taken responsibility for St Michaels too. He was inducted as our Parish Priest on Friday 10th June 2011 by Father David Ryan of Stroud Deanery on behalf of Bishop Declan. We here at St Michaels are determined to move the Parish forward as a family of God and we would like you to be part of our family.

Due to the recent changes our weekend Mass **is now on Sunday morning** @ **9.00am.** There is also a Mass on Wednesday at 6.30pm, the day and time may change but details will be posted on the website. The Church is also open during the week at various times for quiet prayer and reflection.
