MASS PROPERS FOR FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT (Year A)

Entrance Antiphon: To You, I lift up my soul, O my God, to You, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Not let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in You be put to shame.

First Reading - Isaiah 2: 1-5 *The Lord will gather all nations into the peace of His Kingdom*

Responsorial Psalm I rejoiced when I heard them say: ‘Let us go to God’s House.’

Second Reading - Romans 13: 11-14 *We are waiting for Our Lord to come*

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, Alleluia! Let us see, O Lord, your mercy and give us your saving help. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 24: 37-44 *Stay awake so that you may be ready*

Communion Antiphon: The Lord will bestow His bounty, and our earth shall yield its increase.

ADVENT I This season is a time of expectation, waiting and hope. “Advent” means “arrival” or “coming,” prompting us to pause each day and remember why Jesus came/comes/will come again and why we should come to Him. The Advent Wreath is originally a German custom for counting the Sundays before Christmas arrives and it is made out of evergreens. Advent candles shine brightly in the midst of darkness, reminding us that Jesus came as Light into our dark world. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas; the first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-coloured. The circle reminds us of God’s unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. One way to understand the candles follows.

- The first candle symbolizes hope and is called the "Prophet's Candle." The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.
- The second candle represents faith and is called "Bethlehem's Candle." Micah had foretold that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem, which is also the birthplace of King David.
- The third candle symbolizes joy and is called the "Shepherd's Candle." To the shepherd's great joy, the angels announced that Jesus came for humble, unimportant people like them, too. In liturgy, the colour rose signifies joy.
- The fourth candle represents peace and is called the "Angel's Candle." The angels announced that Jesus came to bring peace--He came to bring people close to God and to each other again.

Attending Church during Advent we are able to sit in silence, away the commercial world in which we live in.

ADULT EDUCATION DEPT. The Advent Mission Calendar invites us all to keep those in material need in their hearts as we begin a new liturgical year. With the Cost-of-Living crisis, many people will feel the financial strain heavily this winter, and foodbanks have already experienced increased need. The Advent Mission Calendar offers a different suggestion for each day based on items foodbanks often need. This calendar can be done individually or as a group of parishioners. The gifts can be collected at Sunday Mass and delivered to the local foodbank. This a great opportunity to get more involved and make contact with the local foodbank, see if there are more specific requests, and to start developing a relationship. **St John of God Homes for Ukraine Presentation** (1 December 18:00-19:30, Clifton Cathedral) Ukraine project is seeking to find individuals who may be able to sponsor a Ukrainian refugee.
