OCTOBER - MONTH OF THE ROSARY The "Rosary Technique of Meditation" (using familiar, vocal prayers and counting beads to free the mind to ponder on the scene) is used in the Dominican Rosary to ponder on 4 sets of 5 mysteries. St Dominic gave this from to the tradition to help convert the Albigensian Heretics to the Faith. The same Technique of Meditation is used in other forms of the Rosary - The Franciscan Crown pondering the 7Joys of Our Lady, The Servite or Dolour Rosary meditating on the 7 sorrows of the Virgin. The Chaplet of Divine Mercy. Any and all of these prove the point that the Rosary IS the Gospel on Its Knees. The meditations help to bring us ever closer to the heart of the Good News of Jesus Christ, as exemplified in the life of the Blessed Virgin. The Church hopes and prays that those using the Rosary technique will not only "look at" the mysteries, but actually enter into them, learning from them, loving and living them day by day.
