THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK In Catholic England, before the destruction of so much by the Tudor Dynasty, St John the Baptist was the patron of Cirencester's RC church and of the town. He is still the town's patron. St John's Hospital, like St Thomas' Hospital were vital institutions in civic and religious life, fulfilling the intentions of the original donors. We send our prayers and best wishes to our neighbours in Christ, the Anglican congregation using St John the Baptist church today, together with their clergy.

It is hard for us to even picture the jollifications in church and borough that accompanied the Baptist's Birthday. Many believed in romantic magic associated with Midsummer, practicing various rituals to try and find out who a young girl or man would marry.

The revels were probably extended to run into the general festivities around the Solemnity of the Apostles Peter and Paul, the 29th June. For the 'Corinnian' Catholics of today, this is our patronal feast, being the name parishioners chose in 1888 for the new church to replace the Immaculate Conception in London Road.

Catholic theology teaches that Christ came into the world to share our life in every way, and not just our religious life. Past generations were much happier than we are to mix social and religious celebrations. Perhaps we could get back to those halcyon days!
