

## Away Day Focusing on the Eucharist for Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and other Volunteers: 27<sup>th</sup> April

If you are an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, a Catechist of any description, an adult altar server or anybody who requires a DBS check to function as a volunteer in the parish, you are warmly invited, and indeed encouraged, to attend an away day at Sacred Heart's parish on the  $27^{th}$  April. The morning will commence with Mass at 10.a.m in the Church. This will be followed by two 45-minute sessions in the hall presented by Fr. David on Jesus, the Passover, and the Eucharist, followed by a lunch break. Please bring your own lunch, tea and coffee etc for the day will be provided. In the afternoon Janice Pearson, the Diocesan Safeguarding Co-ordinator will give a 45-minute training session on Safeguarding. The Catholic Church as part of its serious commitment to safeguarding has made it a requirement that all volunteers in parishes receive some safeguarding training. Janice's session will fulfill this requirement for anybody who requires a DBS check to function in a parish and would be a great opportunity to do this training with other volunteers on a face-to-face basis rather than on- line. It is envisaged that the day will end shortly after 2 pm. Please do attend both the retreat day on the Eucharist and the safeguarding session.

## **Sunday 21st April is Vocations Sunday.**



The course will take place April to July this year at The Immaculate Conception parish hall in



## **Certificate in Catechesis**



This two-year course is for catechists and for those who wish to transmit the Catholic faith to others. The Light of Truth Certificate in Catechesis prepares you for these essential roles: catechetical work in your parish, school, or diocese understanding and communicating the Catholic Faith to adults, youth, and children in face of cultural challenges teaching, witnessing to, and accompanying others in their journey of faith. It equips them to share their faith with confidence, passion, and in faithfulness to the Catholic tradition, using the sources of catechesis.

Those applying would include catechists, children's Liturgy leaders, parents, and everyone passionate about passing on the Catholic faith to others. No previous qualification is required to sign up for the programme.
