Dear Friends,

I am the vine, you are the branches... remain in me, you will be fruitful... you can do nothing without *me...*

Reflecting on our oneness in Christ, today's Gospel passage offers us the image of the vine and the branches. Fruitfulness of the branches depends on their union, connection with the vine. Fruitfulness also depends on the branches being trimmed, pruned, and cleaned. We could rephrase it to read "fruitfulness depends on being tamed, disciplined, controlled, directed, channelled, etc. - wild branches do not yield... they become unyielding!" The branches become fruitful only in the vine. Abide in Christ... be united with him... live in his spirit... you will bear much fruit! The vine itself doesn't bear the fruit. Vine bears the branches and feeds the branches, and the branches bear the fruit. Be constantly fed by the "word" of Jesus and the "bread" of life and "cup" of compassion that Jesus offers. You will be fruitful.

Be open and docile to the Holy Spirit! Be open to being pruned; trimmed, cleansed, disciplined, tamed... be docile to the pruning process of the heavenly father...wild branches become unyielding! Be yielding... Be fruitful!

<u>A Warm Welcome:</u> today is Sunday 28th April. As always, we welcome visitors and newcomers to join our "regulars," asking Almighty God to bestow His blessings and graces on us all. You are most welcome to join us for coffee and tea in the Parish Hall.

CAFOD Second Collection: The people of Sudan need our help urgently. We are launching an emergency appeal for donations to get aid to them on the biggest scale we can muster. When violence broke out last year in Sudan between government and paramilitaries, most aid agencies evacuated. Now, humanitarian workers are struggling to get back into Sudan to help, meaning severe delays in getting aid to the people, and the challenges of getting into areas where fighting is still going on remain. Our Caritas and Church networks are there when many aid agencies aren't, where people are in a desperate situation.

CAFOD, A Year of Encounter: With a UK general election due sometime this year, politicians will be looking for our votes. We have a responsibility as Catholics to make sure that parties commit to tackling issues such as poverty and injustice. Raising our voices and contacting parliamentary candidates as a parish community will send a strong signal to those standing for election in our local constituencies. Diocesan Pilgrimage to Glastonbury – Sunday 14th July



The Annual Pilgrimage to Glastonbury will take place on Sunday, 14th July 2024. This year's pilgrimage will be centred around the theme of 'Mary, Woman of Prayer'.

From 12 noon until 3:00 pm, the Shrine Church will transform into a chapel of Exposition and Silent Adoration, offering a peaceful and contemplative environment just opposite the Abbey grounds. During this time, visiting priests will provide the sacrament of Reconciliation in the Shrine Church.

Bishops issue pastoral reflection on gender

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have issued a pastoral reflection on gender, highlighting the teaching of the Church but stressing that accompanying those struggling with gender dysphoria is "a complex but essential pastoral task."

The document, titled Intricately woven by the Lord: A pastoral reflection on gender by the bishops of England and Wales, emphasises that all are welcome in the Church, but says that the sexual identity of an individual is not a purely "cultural or social construction."

The document refutes the idea, proposed by Gender Identity Theory, that everyone has an 'inner' gender identity, which sometimes fails to match the biological sex of the individual. It upholds the value of the body and importance of sexual differentiation.

The bishops assert that we are all created in the image of God, with a dignity given to us by our creator and stresses that leading people to the fullness of life in Christ is a journey rooted in truth as well as compassion.

Bishop David Oakley, Bishop of Northampton, said:

"We have published this document because we know that those working in pastoral settings can find this issue complex. It is also an issue that needs to be handled sensitively.

"Accompaniment is crucial to the journey of faith, and we wish to emphasise that everyone is welcome in the Church. It is vital that as followers of Christ we imitate the boundless mercy and compassion of God as we deal with the complexity of another's life.

"But this needs to be done with a clear understanding of the Catholic vision and understanding of the human person and a holistic view of human sexuality."

CAFOD launches emergency appeal to support 'world's worst crisis' in Sudan

CAFOD has launched an emergency appeal to support families in Sudan, as Britain's Ambassador to the United Nations says that Sudan is in the grip of the world's worst hunger and displacement crisis.

With over eight million people having fled their homes to escape violence, after fighting erupted a year ago between government forces and paramilitaries, and with 25 million in urgent need of humanitarian assistance, CAFOD says there is a short window to act before the growing season in Sudan starts in June, as fears grow of an impending - yet preventable – famine.

Jo Kitterick, CAFOD's director of participation, said: "Many aid agencies exited Sudan when the current fighting erupted a year ago. Right now Catholic agencies in the Caritas network that CAFOD is part of, supported by the Church of Sudan, are some of the only organisations able to deliver aid to support the Sudanese people. The communities we serve in Sudan have issued a desperate cry for help and we are inviting the Catholic community to stand alongside us and the local Sudanese organisations we fund in responding to their call."

CAFOD has been working alongside communities in Sudan for over fifty years. Donations made to its Sudan crisis appeal – whether online or via collections in parishes this weekend – will go towards supporting families in Sudan and surrounding countries, who are already contending with extreme hunger, as communities strive to stop the crisis becoming the worst in living memory.

Speaking at the weekend, Ambassador Barbara Woodward, the UK's permanent representative to the United Nations, told the UN Security Council that while Sudan is in the grip of the world's worst hunger and displacement crisis, "it is not too late for Sudan to return from the brink," as she urged the warring parties in Sudan to engage in political negotiations to bring about peace, and for greater access to humanitarian access to reach those most in need.
