The Most Holy Trinity



Dear Friends,

Today, we celebrate one of the most important doctrines of the Church: Most Holy Trinity - God as Father, Son and Spirit in one single, indivisible communion of persons. Many have attempted to explain this dogma in a variety of ways. None of them can adequately explain the meaning and the power this doctrine has over our lives. We need to understand and accept this as "The Mystery" which we can only contemplate, before which we stand in awe and wonder and amazement and adoration and admiration.

God is Mystery and the Mystery of God is known only through God's self-revelation. Mystery does not mean "mysterious", something that is abstract, out there somewhere or something that cannot be known or understood. Mystery is profound truth - Reality, not facts, not verifiable information but profound truth, eternal truth. The more we come to know truth, the more there is to know. The more

we know mystery, the more there is to know. Mystery is revealed and hidden at the same time.

Mystery has to be experienced – we must plunge into mystery. We must experience the mystery of God, be baptized into the mystery of God, be immersed into the mystery of God's life and love. To know is to become one with that which is known. God is Mystery - known and hidden. To know God is to "abide", "dwell" in God - to be in communion with God.

No one has ever seen God. Yet, if we love one another, God dwells in us and His love is brought to perfection in us. The way we know that we remain in him and he in us, is that he has given us of his spirit. We have seen for ourselves and can testify that the Father has sent the Son as Saviour of the world. When anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwells in him and him in God. (1 John 4:12-15)

Mathew tells us in today's Gospel that Jesus commissioned his disciples to go forth in the power of God their Father, in the name of the Son their redeemer and inflamed by the love of the Spirit to share with the world what they had experienced and to Baptize, to immerse the world into the mystery of God's life and love. Jesus claimed that full authority had been given to Him in heaven and on earth and it is this authority that He shared with His disciples. He commissioned them with His own mission just as His father had commissioned Him. We are called to continue and fulfill this mission today.

Could you serve as a Foundation Governor?

The time has come for seven new Foundation Governors to be recruited to replace the Interim Executive Board at St Joseph's school.

The process to apply and the expectations of governors is spelled out below. You will need to return an application form to the diocese and there will be a short interview process to make sure we have a good balance of people on the governing body with a broad skill-set.

The following information is taken from a Clifton Diocese leaflet which can be found online using the QR code at the end of this document:

Why am I needed?

Foundation governors have an important part to play in ensuring the Catholic character of our schools and in building the community of Catholic schools throughout the diocese. Without them our schools are in jeopardy of losing their distinctiveness which will have a significant impact on the future lives of our children.

What is a foundation governor?

Foundation governors are volunteers who serve as the Bishop's representative to assist in leading our Catholic schools. They work alongside other governors to form a governing body or board of directors, who are responsible for the strategic direction of the school. They are involved in decisions about all aspects of the school – such as buildings and budgets, monitoring standards and the Catholic ethos.

Foundation Governors have specific responsibility for admissions to the school, the employment of staff, Religious Education, Relationship Education, the prayer life of the school and for ensuring that Bishop's directives are implemented. The governors help determine the future for pupils attending our schools. The work of the Governing Body is facilitated by a Clerk and training and support for governors is provided by the Diocesan Department for Schools and Colleges and the Local Authority.

What qualities do I need to become a foundation governor?

You should be a practising Catholic. Other important qualities for being a foundation governor are a belief in the value of Catholic education, enthusiasm, and commitment. You do not need teaching experience and it is useful to bring skills from all areas of your life; such as financial, human resources, buildings, health and safety, safeguarding, parish work and community work.

What will I be asked to do as a foundation governor?

- to attend and contribute to meetings of the full governing body (usually between 3 and 6 per year) and at least one of its sub-committees (approximately a further 3 per year).
- to take an interest in the life of the school/college, to attend some of the public events during the academic year and to see something of the school/college at work (often by being associated with a particular subject area).
- you may be asked to attend interviews associated with staff appointments or serve on special panels associated with admissions, disciplinary or employment matters
- to fully support all agreed policies and monitor their implementation
- to keep informed about policies which the school has devised in order to meet the statutory requirements as outlined in the Governor's Handbook. This involves some reading and 'homework' to keep up to date with requirements, and ensuring that policies are regularly updated
- to take part in the visiting programme arranged for governors to come into school
- to undertake governor training with the Diocese and others as appropriate
- to maintain the confidentiality of governors' meetings. How long will I be asked to serve as a foundation governor?

Governors are appointed for a four-year term of office, after which they can be reappointed or pass the role on to someone else. You can of course resign at any time during your term should you wish to do so.

Is there any remuneration for the role of foundation governor?

There is no remuneration for being a governor, though out of pocket expenses may be claimed for attendance at meetings and for other business as a governor.

How old do you have to be to serve as a foundation governor?

You have to be over the age of 18.

How do I become a school governor?

If you're interested in serving as a foundation governor you can apply easily online via https://schools.cliftondiocese.com/form-2 or contact the Diocesan office for a paper form .
