

Luke 17:11-19 - Ten lepers asked Jesus for healing. Jesus sent them to the priests, and they were healed on the way. One of them returned to give thanks. He affirmed and appreciated the faith and the gratitude of this leper, who under all circumstances would never have been noticed by anyone.
