TWENTY NINTH SUNDAY



Dear Friends,

Luke 18:1-8 - Be steadfast. Even an unjust judge awards a just decision to a widow because of her persistence, perseverance. God will take care of the needs of his people. Pray. Be patient. Persevere. Be steadfast in faith.

For the past 16 weeks or so Luke has been taking us on a journey with Jesus to Jerusalem through different geographical territories, among foreign, unfriendly people, into the moral and ethical concerns of many and often into the dark recesses of the human heart. Throughout this journey, Jesus was deeply engaged in the formation of his disciples: revealing to them God's love; calling

them to God's saving will; encouraging them to challenge the values of the world; charging them with the mission of proclaiming the Good News; counselling them on how this mission has to be fulfilled; giving them a new lifestyle to live.

When the disciples seemed to find the challenge of discipleship overwhelming, Jesus gave them sound advice which has withstood the test of times and continues to support us today. Remember the Gospel passage two weeks ago when the disciples talked about their struggle with the demands and asked for an increase of faith, Jesus' advice was to trust the little faith they had and let it come to life. Last week, the advice was to be gratefully and thoughtfully aware of God's saving work and his loving presence in life.

This week, the advice is: Be steadfast. Stand your ground. Be patient, Persevere. Pray without losing heart. This calls for a shift from self-reliance to God-reliance. Perseverance in prayer is more than true grit that will never quit. It is trust in a God who will never abandon or ignore those who put their trust in Him. It is God-centred and Grace-powered perseverance and not mere human effort or enterprise. It is a radical shift from self to God.

Be steadfast because God's love is steadfast. Never quit because God never does.
